# **Baptist Health Foundation is providing \$500,000 in 2025 to support unmet healthcare needs in Central Alabama**

On November 6, 2025, Baptist Health Foundation announced 52 non-profits in Jefferson, Shelby, Walker, and Talladega counties who will be receiving grants this year from their Community Support Fund. These non-profit organizations are working to provide assistance or programs to meet the underserved healthcare needs in our community. Through Baptist Health Foundation, \$500,000 is being awarded to initiatives addressing four areas- access to healthcare, food insecurity, behavioral health, or needs in the healthcare workforce. Since the inception of this community grant program in 2022, Baptist Health Foundation has provided over \$1.5 million in community support grants.

## PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

### FEEDING THE HUNGRY

#### Grace Klein FeedBHM

FeedBHM is the food rescue initiative of Grace Klein Community.

Volunteers are mobilized from 6am-11pm 7 days a week, to retrieve good food from local restaurants, grocers, cafes, catering companies, farmers, and anywhere else where we can find good food. All rescued food is reallocated from a trip to the landfill and onto the plates of the food insecure.



### FUNDING FOR MENTAL HEALTH

#### Community of Hope Health Clinic

The Community of Hope Health Clinic is a free and charitable clinic located in Pelham, Alabama. The clinic helps Shelby County, Alabama residents who are at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines and do not have access to private insurance or government benefits including Medicare, Medicaid and VA Benefits.





## ADDICTION RECOVERY SUPPORT

### The Foundry

The Foundry is helping people break free from addiction and rebuild their lives with dignity and purpose. The residential addiction recovery program serves 500 individuals per year and works directly with Baptist Health Walker and Baptist Health Princeton hospitals for referrals and intake.

## MEDICAL EQUIPMENT FOR THOSE IN NEED

### Birmingham Metro Baptist Association

By repurposing medical equipment that would otherwise go to waste, the ReMedy program is not only contributing to environmental sustainability but also extending a helping hand to those in need across the Birmingham Metro area.

With the support of the Community Support Fund, ReMedy is preventing nearly \$1 Million worth of used medical equipment from ending up in landfills.







## RESOURCES FOR A SECOND CHANCE

### The Lovelady Center

The Lovelady Center empowers women through Christ-centered initiatives so they can return to society as well-equipped women of God. The Lovelady Center program ensures that each woman is taught how to overcome barriers to success by providing not only much needed services, but also life skills and spiritual guidance.

## WORKFORCE EMPLOYMENT

### United Ability

United Ability is the state's largest provider of services for individuals with disabilities serving 5800 clients each year. Their workforce employment program provided 100 students to Baptist Health Princeton Hospital, Baptist Health Brookwood Hospital, and Baptist Health Shelby hospital last year.

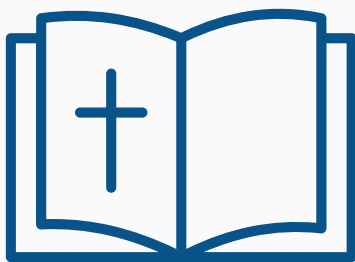
